Pediatric Trauma Program

The Pediatric Trauma Program is a CNH District charity partner that raises funds to provide resources to prevent injuries and deaths caused by pediatric trauma. Pediatric trauma is the leading cause of death for children ages 14 and under and PTP seeks to aid in preventing these incidents.



The Children's Miracle Network is a Key Club International charity partner that raises funds and awareness for children's hospitals. It has had a profound impact on communities by providing over 32 million medical treatments for children every year.



SERVICE PROJECT ideas

Decorate & Donate Children's Helmets

There are lots of kids out and about during the summer, and lots are out biking or skateboarding. You could apply for a grant and buy helmets, and decorate them with your club! Once they're decorated, you could reach out to local elementary schools or your local library to donate them. This teaches children the importance of safety, and is a great way to get members involved with the decorating.

Assemble Care Packages

You could gather donations from your members and local community to make safety care packages! These care packages could include hygiene products, bandages, disinfectant, and more. After, you could host a service event where members assemble these care packages. After, donate them to a local shelter or non-profit organization within your community. This helps to provide others with resources to keep themselves safe!

Community Garden

Start a community garden in your school or in your city. Reach out to the appropriate people in charge and work with them to find a place and schedule for the community garden. Although this project is more long term, it could provide lots of healthy and organic vegetables and fruit for people in your community, contributing to health and safety. Additionally, it brings people together, as everyone can contribute!

FUNDRAISER ideas





You could reach out to local farmers and businesses in your community and ask if they would like to participate in a fundraising farmer's market! You could charge a slight fee for vendors, and donate all money you make towards PTP or the Children's Miracle Network. This promotes healthy eating and supports lots of local businesses in your community. You could make it a huge event, with performers and music too!

Host a Sports Tournament

Everyone likes a little bit of healthy competition, right? Any sport, like basketball or volleyball, can get lots of community involvement. You could host a sports tournament and charge a fee for each team that enters! Make it a huge deal within your school and community. The tournament could be elimination-style, creating lots of suspense for the whole event. At the end, the winners could get a prize, and everything else can be donated!

Sell Leis

As June is Graduation season, you could sell leis to fundraise for PTP, the Children's Miracle Network, or even for your own projects! Buy ribbon from any local craft store, and watch a Youtube tutorial. You could have your members make leis, and make an event out of it for some fund bonding. After, the leis can be sold to the public to raise money for your causes and service projects. It's a simple, yet effective way to fundraise for your community!



PROMOTION ideas

Volunteer with Youth Sports

During summer, lots of youth leagues and sports start to pick up. Volunteer to work with, referee, or even coach some youth sports games in your local community. Reach out to your local Parks and Recreation Department, and see if there are any opportunities for your club to get involved with youth sports! This way, you'll be able to promote exercising and staying active, making for a healthy lifestyle. It gets your club more involved in your community too!

Create Health and Safety Flyers

Create some digital flyers promoting a healthy and safe lifestyle. It could be about a certain aspect about health or safety, or it could be a general flyer. Share these with organizations in your area and encourage them to post on their social media. Place the flyers on bulletin boards. Share them with your school. Do your best to share your information as much as you can!

Host a Food Drive with a Local Organization

Food scarcity is a big problem in lots of communities, and having access to healthy food contributes greatly to health and safety. So, reach out to a local organization! Let them know of your mission to provide healthy and safe food for your community, and work with them to host a food drive. Gather food from people in your community to donate to shelters and other people that may need it. It can make a big difference.
