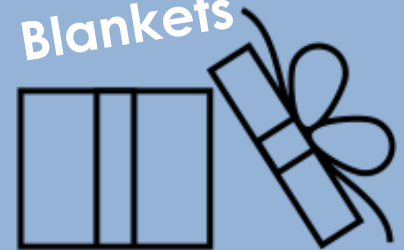

### EVENT IDEAS

Take some fleece material, have members cut strips along the edges, and tie the material together. Now you have some warm blankets! This is a fun project for members to do indoors, and you can donate the blankets to a homeless shelter or any other place in need.
