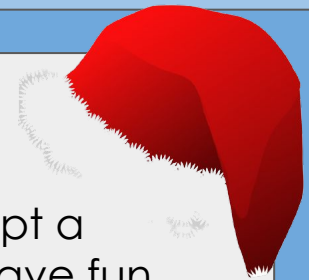

Clothes Drive

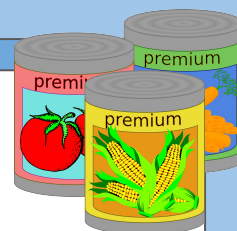
