KIWIN'S

K-Kids is where elementary school students begin developing their hearts for service. This student-led service leadership program builds leadership skills and strong moral character while giving students an opportunity to participate in service projects.

Nearly 40,000 middle and junior high students in 1,300 clubs in 18 nations contribute service to school and community while developing leadership and people skills. They learn self-confidence and become tomorrow's leaders through teamwork.

KIWIN's is the 32nd District of Key Club International. They are located in California, Nevada, and Hawaii and consist of over 44 clubs with approximately 2,500 members and growing. Similar to Key Club, KIWIN'S promotes good citizenship through service and aim to improve their schools and communities.

KIWANIS

Adult volunteers have been serving the children of the world through fundraising and hands-on service projects. Kiwanis created its family of sponsored leadership clubs to help people of all ages develop the heart to serve, answer the call to lead and accept the courage to engage.

AKTION CLUB

Aktion Club members in more than 200 clubs in seven nations allow adults living with disabilities to develop initiative and leadership skills through hands-on service. These adults return to the community the benefits, help, and caring they have received.

CIRCLE K

Circle K International (CKI) is the premier university service organization in the world sponsored by Kiwanis International. With clubs on more than 550 campuses globally, programming is based upon the tenets of service, leadership, and fellowship.

BOOK DRIVE


CRAFT DAY
