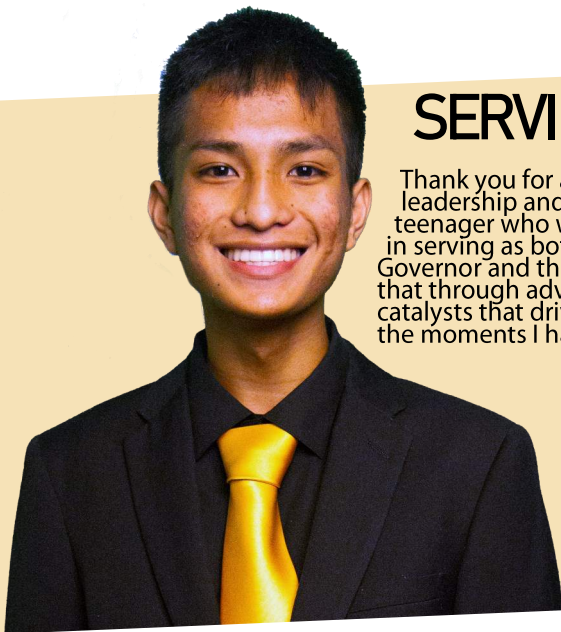

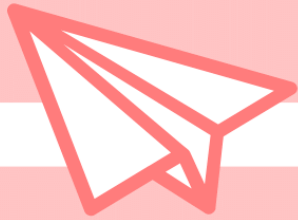

Key Leader is an opportunity for students to better understand themselves and develop meaningful connections with others, allowing them to develop important social and emotional skills that can help them to initiate friendships, resolve conflicts, and make good and ethical decisions!

HOW DO I REGISTER FOR KEY LEADER?

The pricing for attendees is as follows:

- Student participant: **\$250**
- Student Facilitator: **\$200**
- Adult Chaperone: **\$225**

WHAT IS CAUCUS?



Caucus is where each division candidate is given a set period of time to give a brief speech that speaks of their goals and qualifications, and then they answer questions from delegates. Do not make inappropriate comments, your goal is to make informed decisions on the candidate's potential!

TYPES OF QUESTIONS



- Personal Questions that help you understand why the candidate decided to run
- Trivia Questions to see if the candidate is informed on key topics such as preferred charities!
- Vision Questions that provide insight on the candidate's platform and goals for the term.

WHAT IS THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES?



House of Delegates is a forum for candidates of each office to present their final message to the District Delegates. At the conclusion of balloting for District offices, the Committee Chair will present any proposed District Bylaw changes that have been approved for presentation to the delegates. A majority vote by the delegates is needed for adoption of Bylaw additions or revisions. Finally, the Committee Chair will present the Convention Resolutions for approval by the House of Delegates. The attendance of the House consists of the delegates-at-large and two delegates from each club in attendance.

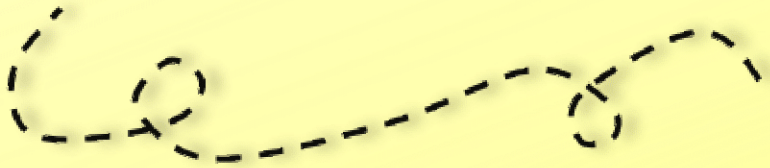

WHAT IS NOMINATION CONFERENCE?



Nominating conference, or nom-com, is when you take all the candidates running for a position and narrow it down to the two top candidates for members to vote on. This takes place when there are more than two candidates.



WHAT IS THE PURPOSE?

Nom-Com reduces the number of candidates for a District office or International President/Vice President endorsement to two or International Trustee endorsements to four. After nom-com takes place, then the finalists will compete for that office or endorsement at the House of Delegates.

HOW DOES IT WORK AND WHO VOTES?

The attendance of Nominating Conference consists of the delegates from clubs. The candidates will be introduced to the Conference and voted on in the following order: Governor, Secretary, Treasurer, and individuals seeking International Endorsement. There will be no speeches or questions. When all the candidates for a given office have been Introduced, the delegates shall mark the ballot for that office and the ballots are counted and the two highest candidates go on to the House of Delegates for final voting.
