


D37W LTG ARIA PHAN

mnt trivia


Kalani Key Club | D22H | R18

"Officers brainstormed an educational activity regarding MNT and one officer created an interactive trivia for members on Gimkit. We held this event during a general meeting on Zoom. Members connected to the trivia game with personal devices (i.e., phones, computers, etc.) Since fundraising options are currently limited due to quarantine, we used this event as a foundation to educate club members about MNT so that they understand why and what we are fundraising for in the future. The project was successful in educating our members. If we were to do this again, we should test the trivia software with a large group of people so that it can accommodate the 25+ members that tried to join during the meeting. We'd also like to focus more on fundraising next time or partner with an organization that focuses on Project Eliminate."

project eliminate awareness week

"Kaiser took inspiration from the Eliminate week that took place on the CNH Instagram, and planned out social media posts for members for the last week of May. We decided on MNT Monday (spread awareness of MNT and Project Eliminate on social media), eLEMONate Wednesday (eat a lemon in support of Project Eliminate), and Awareness Friday (post a baby picture of yourself and resources to donate to Project Eliminate). Prior to the Eliminate Week, members also played a Kahoot! game at Kaiser's general meeting to learn more about MNT. This project was a fun way for members to get active, learn about MNT and Project Eliminate, and for members to spread awareness to their friends and families. The project was successful and many people were able to find out more information about Project Eliminate. I think if we had more participation we could have had a greater reach. If we tried this project again once we meet in person, even if it's not the Spotlight in Service, I believe it could be a bigger success."



cranes for a cure

Mills Key Club | D34N | R17

"Originally, I suggested the "Cranes For A Cure" service idea in our board group chat as a monthly service opportunity. I was looking for non-conventional, arts-and-craft types of ways to do service online and found an organization called "Joey's Wings." The website has a fundraising project that collects folded origami cranes and uses them to build amazing art pieces and mobiles. The pieces are sold and the money made from them go towards funding pediatric cancer research. When I wrote down my idea and possible logistics, our LTG Kristen saw my message and suggested our club use the idea for a Division wide event during the month of May! We were excited and nervous at the same time,

but we thought it was a good opportunity to get our club out there and gather everyone online for service. 


SIDEWALK ART

VIRTUAL MASK MAKING EVENT Meiqi Lai, Glen A. Wilson | D35W


