





## a guide to DCON DELEGATE DUTIES!

### what is a Delegate?



As a dues-paid member, you have an opportunity to serve as a **delegate** at **DCON 2023**! A delegate is a representative of a club that listens to candidates during House of Delegates and votes for the next District Executives.

### why should YOU be a Delegate?






