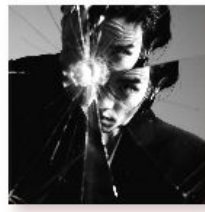

Since there are so many different uses of a website, you can decide to use your website in **whatever** way needed and it can be a **useful resource** to your club. Before going deep into the design aspect of your website, make sure to have a proper navigation bar that is always **accessible** to the user, so they can jump from to one page to another at any time. Before adding content to your pages, decide on **colors** and **fonts** first to make the process easier! Try to choose colors that **relate** to your **club/division**. Try to stick to **2-3** colors to keep it consistent. We recommend using Key Club **graphic standard fonts**, such as **Century Gothic** or **Verdana**, although it isn't required. However, try to keep font styling and sizes **consistent!** Make sure to adhere to the CNH graphics standards when making your website.

Revamping Websites

To revamp a website means to **repair it** or **rebrand** the design, especially if there has been a large gap of time since the website was updated. Due to this gap of time in which presumably many things have happened within your club, such as events, it is **important** to make sure to **refresh the website** with all of that new information or news. Make sure to take plenty **breaks** and **rest** as this process will most likely be tiring and take a long time. Be sure to also make sure the design of your website is **up to date** with **current** graphic standards.

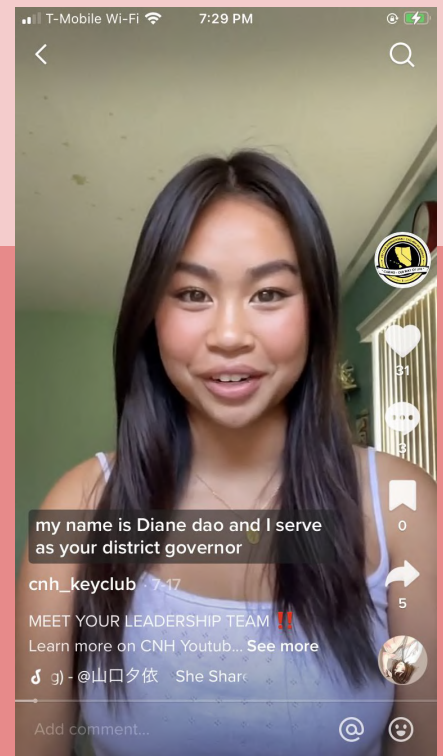
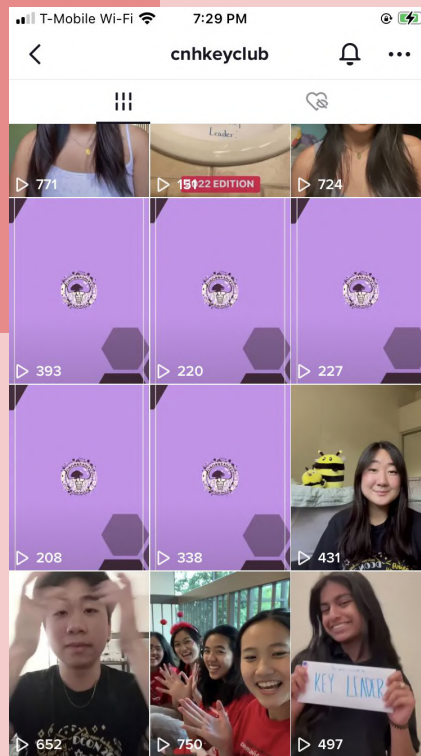
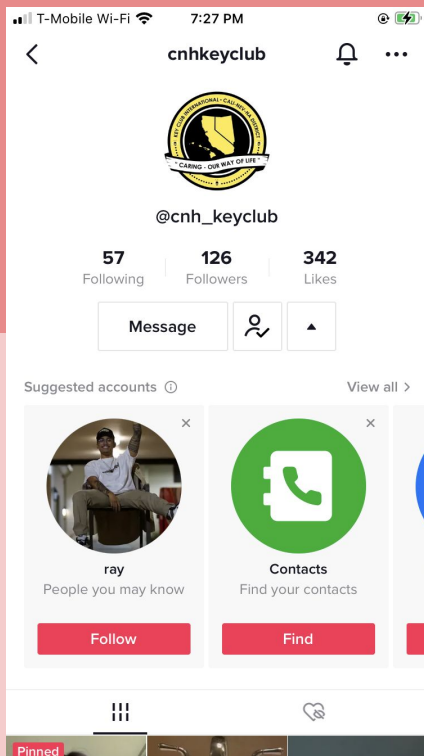

USING TIK TOK

Tik Tok has quickly become more popular within the norms of our generation. To take CNH's Social Media Standards to the next level, we created a CNH Tik Tok! **Follow us @cnh_keyclub** to stay updated with new events, and even try participating and stitching to our videos too!

USING INSTAGRAM

Using Instagram is **KEY** for effective promotion. Following members are updated on division events through every infographic posted onto their feed.

PHOTO OVERLAYS are an amazing way for members to promote upcoming events on a personal level. Some examples include Region Training Conference, Fall Rally, and District Convention.

FLYERS help members keep up to date on division events. Even though these can be sent out electronically, they can also be passed out during meetings.

INFOGRAPHICS are extremely beneficial step by step, guides on processes for certain tasks.

BENEFITS: Videos are very fun to watch. Be creative with your videos and have fun with it! Make sure you are promoting it efficiently to get viewers thrilled about the upcoming event.

TIPS: When producing a video, make sure that there is not too much text on the screen. Focus on the material that is being presented through skits, storytelling, etc.

EXAMPLES: Instagram lives, webinars, tutorials, promotions, etc.



TIPS & RESOURCES


STAY ACTIVE Make sure to be uploading constantly on social media to let your members know that you are active! Social media is such a unique tool that allows us to stay connected from a distance, so BEE sure to take advantage of that and update your platforms consistently.

BEE UNIQUE You can collaborate with your officer board to brainstorm some fun social media marketing ideas– such as officer takeovers or livestreams! Make sure to show your members how creative you are.

OBSERVE! Stay vigilant and see what kinds of social media activity works best for you and your club. For example, a specific type of trend mentioned may not garner much engagement from your club members. Try to track the data analytics of each post and take note of what does well and what doesn't so that you can improve!

What should I complete during registration?

- After the application process, SAA Captain Candidates will be interviewed by SAA Coordinator, Caleb Kim.

delegate

What is a delegate?

Delegates vote for the 2023-2024 District Executive board. Each club in attendance at DCON **MUST** have **TWO** registered delegates.

delegate (cont.)

How do I become a delegate?

If interested, speak with your club officer board about becoming a delegate for your club. Your club will then register you as a delegate once agreed upon.

presenters

Who presents workshops at DCON?

YOU! District Board members, guest speakers, and members like you can present workshops at DCON to better educate the District.

How do I become a presenter?

Information about presenter applications will be released before DCON. After the application process, presenter candidates will be interviewed by the Membership Development & Education Committee.
