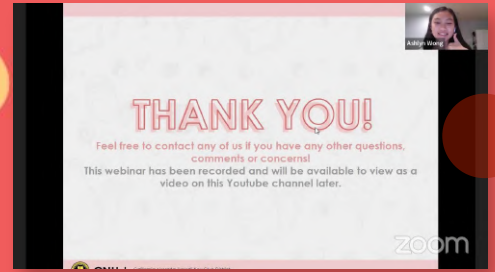

# WHAT IS A RTC CHAIR?

A Region Training Conference Chairperson (RTC Chair) is a **Lieutenant Governor** who was chosen to **lead their region's RTC** in their term. As the RTC Chair, it's their responsibility to conduct weekly meetings with the Region Advisors and other Lt. Governors. The chairperson must be communicating with the team at least twice a week to avoid any confusion. They must also create an **Action Plan documenting all tasks** that must be completed **prior to RTC**. In addition, it's crucial to compile everything into a Google Drive Folder in order to keep things organized and easily accessible.

When it comes to tasks of a Chairperson, this could be different for each Region, however, the main tasks could include: Creating the **programs**, **planning a budget**, reaching out to **Guest Speakers**, being the **liaison** between the members/officers/guests speakers/advisors/chaperones and the rest of the team, and etc.

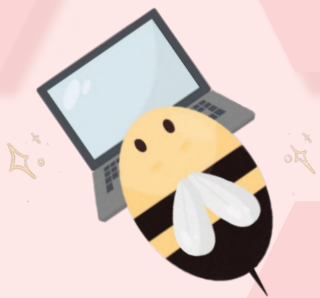

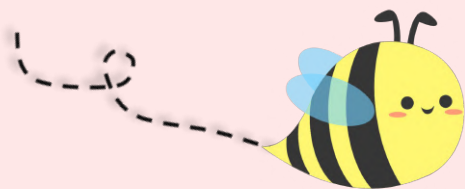

# COST BREAKDOWN

## Registration

**On Time Registration: \$215**

Deadline: March 3rd, 2023

**Late Registration: \$255**

Deadline: March 17th, 2023

All attendees (members and chaperones) must pay the registration fee

## Hotel

The estimated hotel cost will be \$210 per night, and everyone will be staying for two nights. As 4 people will be staying per room, this comes to a cost of around **\$105 total per person**



# COST BREAKDOWN

In addition to registration and transportation, the club is expected to pay for chaperones to attend, so raising funds as a club is essential



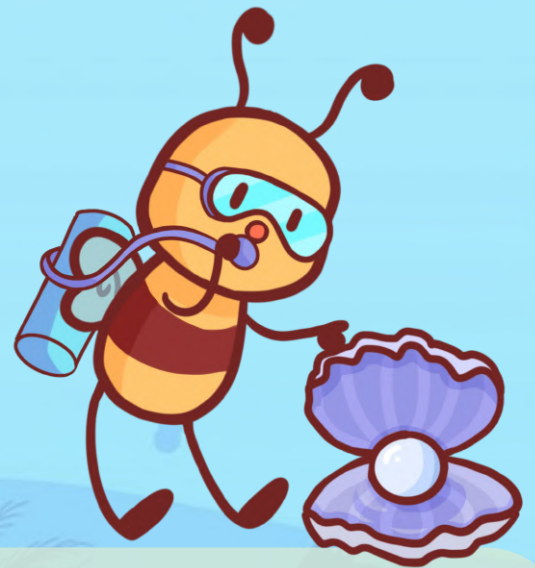

### **Recycling Fundraiser**

Some recyclable goods can be redeemed for money! Have your club members collect these from their households and ask to get them from others as well, like your neighbors.

FUNDrive is a way to earn money for donating gently used clothing and household items. Go to the FUNDrive site (<https://fundrive.savers.com>) to learn more and sign up!

### **Shoe Drive**

There are numerous sites and organizations that let you turn gently used donated shoes into money. Find one that works for your area, and collect used shoes from your members or others to donate!

Ask local businesses if you can place a Key Club donation jar on their counter. Include an explanation of what Key Club is on the jar!

# BASICS OF CLUB BYLAWS

## *basics of club bylaws*

---

### *what club bylaws are*

Club bylaws are a set of rules for each club. They create transparency with members and officers by setting expectations/requirements and outlining club processes.

### *importance of bylaws*

They are helpful in guiding the new officer board through their term. Club bylaws also provide a record of how past terms were run and can be updated throughout various terms.

### *where to find them*

Club bylaws are usually submitted to your school's ASB, sponsoring Kiwanis club, and club advisors. You can edit your past club bylaws; we recommend you update them every term. If you cannot find your club bylaws, you can use Key Club International's standard form club bylaws as a guide.

# STANDARD CLUB BYLAWS

## standard club bylaws



### ARTICLE I: Name

Section 1. The name of this organization shall be the Key Club of \_\_\_\_\_ (Name name as school)

### ARTICLE II: Organization

Section 1. Its form of organization, its ideals, and its purpose shall be similar to those of the Kiwanis Club of \_\_\_\_\_ (Kiwanis Club Sponsor)

Section 2. It shall be sponsored by, but not a part of, Kiwanis club of \_\_\_\_\_ The Kiwanis Club assumes all chartering costs. (Kiwanis Club Sponsor)

### ARTICLE III: Objects and Activities

Section 1. The objects of the Key Club shall be:

- 1) To develop initiative and leadership.
- 2) To provide experience in living and working together.
- 3) To serve the school and community.
- 4) To cooperate with the school principal.
- 5) To prepare for useful citizenship.

To accept and promote the following ideals:

To give priority to the human and spiritual, rather than to the material values of life. To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships. To promote the adoption and application of higher standards in scholarship, sportsmanship, and social contacts. To develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive, and serviceable citizenship. To provide a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render unselfish service, and to lead better communities. To cooperate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism, and good will.

Section 2. The activities of the Key Club shall be in accord with its Objects. They should include those suggested by Key Club International, plus such additional activities as might be adopted by the Key Club and approved by the school principal.

### ARTICLE IV: Motto

Section 1. The motto of the Key Club shall be "Caring Our Way of Life."

### ARTICLE V: Membership

Section 1. Membership shall be limited to the high school students as apportioned from the senior, junior, sophomore, and freshman classes by the Board of Directors, who possess the qualifications prescribed by Article 6, Section 1 of the Constitution of Key Club International.

### ARTICLE VI: Officers

Section 1. Officers shall be president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, editor, and webmaster or technology associated position and one director from each class. They shall serve for one (1) year or until their successors are elected and qualify.

Section 2. Each officer shall be a member in good standing. No other restrictions or limitations shall be placed on these officers.

Section 3. There shall be a Board of Directors, composed of the above officers and one director to be elected from each class.

Section 4. The duties of the officers shall be such as are usually performed by similar officer holders, and as outlined by the Key Club International document "Duties of Club Officers."

Section 5. The Board of Directors shall approve the budget, approve all bills, take counsel with committees, discipline members, review and report to Kiwanis the performance of the club officers, and perform such other duties as shall be referred to it by the club, in compliance with these Bylaws and the requirements of Key Club International.

Section 6. All action by the club and the Board of Directors shall be subject to the approval of the principal and the sponsoring Kiwanis club. The Board of Directors shall meet at least once monthly at a time and place selected by the Board.

Section 7. Any general member may recommend the removal of a club officer to the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall hold a meeting at which the officer in question shall be heard. If approved, the recommendation shall be presented to the club and voted on by 2/3 vote of the quorum. In the event any officer should be removed from office, the officer shall be notified in writing by the secretary.

Section 8. The Faculty and Kiwanis Advisors shall serve as ex-officio members of the club Board of Directors, retaining all rights of that membership without the right to vote.

### ARTICLE VII: Election of Officers

Section 1. Election of new officers (president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, and editor) should be held at a meeting in February and they should take office in May.

Section 2. Election of directors (one from each class) shall be held at the first meeting following the opening of school in the fall.

Section 3. All officers and directors who are members in good standing shall be eligible for re-election.

### ARTICLE VIII: Meetings

Section 1. The club shall hold regular weekly meetings at such time and place as shall be determined by the club with the approval of the principal.

### ARTICLE IX: Committees

Section 1. There should be at least the following standing committees:

- a) Kiwanis Family Relations Committee
- b) Program Committee
- c) Project Committee
- d) Public Relations Committee e) Social Committee
- f) Membership Development Committee g) Major Emphasis Committee

Section 2. The duties of the standing committees shall be as follows:

a) The Kiwanis Family Relations Committee shall work with the Program and Project Committees in preparing inter-club activities with Kiwanis and Circle K. If one exists in the area and shall see that the membership of the Key Club and its sponsoring Kiwanis Club are cognizant of all areas of each organization thereof.

b) The Program Committee shall plan and present programs at all regular meetings, club inductions, and inter-club activities with Key Clubs and other service groups in the school and community, unless otherwise directed by the president. The committee shall arrange for a suitable place for club luncheons and see that the space occupied is made orderly after each meeting.

c) The Project Committee shall formulate worthwhile activities, and upon approval by the principal, shall recommend them to the club. The projects adopted by the club shall be initiated and completed under the direction of the Project Committee with the aid of the club membership.

d) The Public Relations Committee shall be responsible for informing the public of the Key Club's activities and goals through the use of articles, photographs, the local newspaper, calls with school officials, radio and television.

e) The Social Committee shall plan the social activities of the club, such as banquets honoring the fathers and mothers of the members, dances, etc., and entertainment for club meetings.

f) The Membership Development Committee shall devise effective plans to obtain new members on a regular basis to provide the necessary manpower for an effective program of service.

g) The Major Emphasis Committee shall plan projects and activities promoting and supporting the Key Club International Theme and Major Emphasis programs during their administrative years.

### ARTICLE X: Annual Dues

Section 1. Total annual dues shall be \$\_\_\_\_\_ per member, which is the sum of \$\_\_\_\_\_ for district dues, \$7.00 for international dues, and \$\_\_\_\_\_ for individual club dues.

### ARTICLE XI: Amendments

Section 1. Amendments to these bylaws shall be adopted by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present at any regular meeting held one week or more after a regular meeting at which the proposed amendment or amendments were read, or after giving written notice thereof to each member one week prior to the action on such amendment or amendments.

Section 2. These bylaws and all amendments or additions thereto shall not become effective until approved by the high school principal, the sponsoring Kiwanis club, and Key Club International.

## *dcon 2022 dues amendment*



During District Convention 2022, an amendment was passed to increase the district dues by 50 cents every term leading up to 2024, until the cost of district dues is \$6.00 per year. Be sure to update Article X of your club bylaws to reflect this!

## *amendment*

### **Article XI: REVENUE**

**Section 1.** Each member club shall pay to the district for each and every member based upon the below district dues schedule:

*Prior to October 1, 2022 the district dues will be \$4.50 per annum.*

*From October 1, 2022 to September 30, 2023 the district dues will be \$5.00 per annum.*

*From October 1, 2023 to September 30, 2024 the district dues will be \$5.50 per annum.*

*From October 1, 2024 and going forward the district dues will be \$6.00 per annum.*

These dues shall accrue on October 1 and shall be remitted to the California-Nevada-Hawaii Key Club District Office by the individual club not later than December 1 of each year.

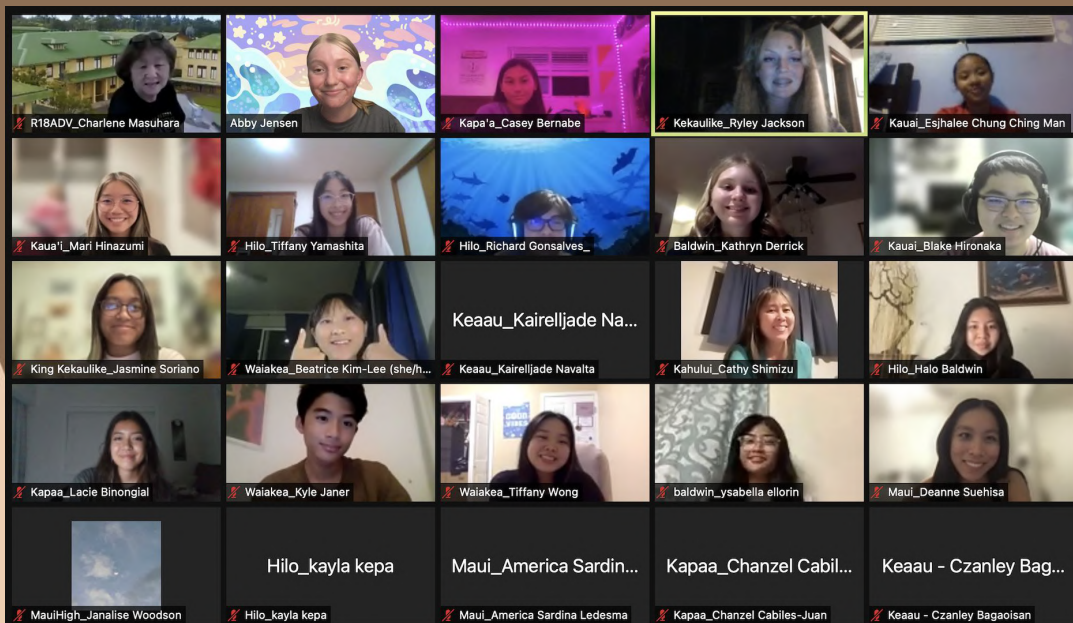
